# Veiled Voices

Our special Summer book display for adults is *Veiled Voices* -- stop in and pick a wrapped mystery book to

#### ANDREW'S PICKS. Marathon Man (John Schlesinger, 1976).

A warning: if you watch this movie, you will be perpetually and inescapably condemned, every time you go for a routine teeth cleaning, to consider the possibility that your friendly neighborhood dentist might be a Nazi war criminal determined to extract not just your molars but the location of a horde of stolen diamonds. If you ask me, it's worth it -1mean, what the heck, it's a great movie and you only go to the dentist every six months. Laurence Olivier is terrific as the insidious Dr. Christian Szell, as is Dustin Hoffman in the role of his victim: and it is, among other things, the contrasting styles of the two acting giants that makes the movie essential viewing. Olivier, of course, was one of the greatest classically-trained actors of the 20th century, whereas Hoffman studied at



the Actors Studio and was a devoted "method" actor. According to Ben Mankiewicz, in order to prepare for the climactic tooth-drilling scene, Hoffman deprived himself of sleep for days and showed up on set looking awful – sick, haggard, utterly bedraggled. Olivier took one look at Hoffman and said, "Have you ever tried acting? It's much easier." A couple years later Olivier followed this up with *The Boys from Brazil* (Franklin J. Schaffner, 1978), where he plays a Nazi hunter trying to stop Gregory Peck's Josef Mengele from breeding an army of Hitler clones. Also well worth seeing.

#### Sidewalk Arts for Youth


